Paul Cederberg



Paul Cederberg passed away on June 14, 2014. A major highlight of his career was the RCMP Centennial year of 1973 where he played a major role in its celebration with the promotional artwork that commemorated the rich history of the RCMP.

Commissioned by his employer, Paul painted five paintings that reflected the RCMP's historical significance in the building of Canada. These images were later used in the design of a commemorative Wilkinson Sword and Winchester Rifle. During this time he also rendered a painting named "The Last Dog Patrol" that was presented to Her Majesty the Queen and his Royal Highness the Duke of Edinburgh on July 4, 1973 at Depot Division, as part of the Royal visit to Canada that year.



The 100th Anniversary of the beginning of the First World War Le 100e anniversaire du début de la Première guerre mondiale



On August 4th, the 100th anniversary of the beginning of the First World War was solemnly marked at the National War Memorial. With that ceremony began Canada's commemorations of the World Wars.

The Ceremonial Guard represented the Canadian Grenadier Guards who fought during the First World War. Parks Canada interpreters accurately depicted the young men and women who answered the call in the summer of 1914. The war dragged on for more than four years. It would prove to be the most costly war in Canadian history with some 66,000 Canadians and 1,305) Newfoundlanders killed, and over 172,000 Canadians and Newfoundlanders wounded.

Le 4 août au Monument national de guerre, nous avons solennellement souligné le 100^e anniversaire du début de la Première Guerre mondiale. Cette cérémonie a aussi marqué le lancement au Canada des activités visant à commémorer les guerres mondiales.

Cela s'avéra la guerre la plus coûteuse dans l'histoire du Canada. 66,000 Canadiens et 1,305 Terre-Neuviens furent tués, et plus de cent 172,000 Canadiens et Terre-Neuviens furent blessés.

Ottawa Division Veterans Support the 25th Anniversary of International Police Peacekeeping Operations.

The articles of incorporation of the RCMP Veterans' Association encourage strong participation in the ongoing affairs of the Force and the Canadian police community. The Association's Ottawa Division recently answered the call.

This year marks the 25th anniversary of international police peacekeeping operations. Since the Force's first deployment to Namibia in 1989, 3,500 Canadian police officers – serving and retired - have served abroad in 58 peace support operations involving 30 countries and conflict zones. As Canada's federal police, the RCMP delivers this service under the auspices of the 'Canadian Police Agreement' (CPA) in partnership with 25 other municipal, regional and provincial agencies across Canada.

The RCMP's International Police Development Branch marked Canada's annual Peacekeepers' Day on Saturday August 9th by hosting a Gala Dinner and Dance at the Canada Aviation Museum, followed by a parade of police peacekeepers on Sunday morning to the Reconciliation Monument in the heart of downtown Ottawa. Both events were very well attended and successful, in no small measure due to the efforts of the RCMP Veterans' Association, Ottawa Division. Ottawa Division Treasurer, Brian Sparrow, tended to accounts receivable for the dinner itself. Marc Dureau dealt with matters of protocol for the Gala Dinner and served as Parade Sergeant Major the following morning. Graham Muir was MC for the Dinner and assumed the role of Parade Police Contingent Commander. The Division's Director of Communication, Suzanne Sarault, served as MC for the ceremony at the Reconciliation Monument.

Several members of the Ottawa Division, as former peacekeepers, were on parade.



All in all, it was a proud moment for Canada's police peacekeepers, for the RCMP, and for the RCMP Veterans' Association.

- **Battlefield Ride 2014.** At the Musical Ride Performance for Veterans, Supt. Joe McAllister was able to raise over \$500 for his ride. On June 6, he participated in the Wounded Warriors Canada Battlefield Ride - 900 kilometres of cycling which started at Juno beach and ended in Vimy. The project was in support of soldiers, serving and retired, suffering from PTSD. Supt. McAllister covered his airfare and related costs. He raised over \$5,000 and all donations went directly to the Wounded Warrior Project. It was his way of giving back to past and current soldiers.

Your direct deposit automatically continues under PWGSC without interruption.

For those who do not already enjoy the convenience of direct deposit, you may wish to register for direct deposit of your monthly pension payment to take advantage of services available through PWGSC after July 2, 2014. You can request a copy of the direct deposit form by contacting the RCMP Benefits Administration Centre at 1-800-661-7595, Monday to Friday between 7:30 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.

The new definition of a Veteran in the Legion General By-Laws is now as follows: *A Veteran is any person who is serving or has honorably served in the Canadian Armed Forces, the Commonwealth or its wartime allies, or as a Regular Member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, or as a Peace Officer in a Special Duty Area or on a Special Duty Operation, or who has served in the Merchant Navy or Ferry Command during wartime.*

This now extends the ability for The Royal Canadian Legion's Service Bureau to support a broader range of Veterans who are in need of the unique assistance available from the Legion. *For more informations, you may contact Mr. Bruce Poulin at 613) 591-3335 ext. 241 or at (613) 292-8760, or at bruce.poulin@legion.ca.*
