RCMP salutes history's unsung heroes

On Tuesday, September 10, Commanding Officer for RCMP National Headquarters, Chief Superintendent Ron Mostrey, and the President of the Ottawa Division RCMP Veterans' Association, Assistant Commissioner retired Graham Muir, paid tribute to the wives of RCMP members who helped nurture and support their husbands' policing careers in some of the country's most isolated communities.

Fifteen women were honoured for the often unrecognized support they provided to the RCMP from the 1900s onwards. Each of their stories outlines unique challenges and hardships they endured while on post, often living in inadequate housing and with growing families of their own to tend to.

During this period of the Force's history, women often performed a range of duties in support of police operations, from answering phones, to searching female prisoners, and providing prisoner meals. Their homes often served as the accommodations for visiting RCMP senior officers, judges, doctors and nurses to whom they also provided meals and entertainment.

"These exceptional women are a testament to the daily sacrifice and commitment our own family members make to support those of us who wear the badge," says Chief Superintendent Mostrey. "These women went beyond that call, often assisting in the day-to-day functions of small-town, remote detachments, building crucial links to the communities we serve and protect."

Also on hand for the NHQ presentation were Jack Briscoe and Suzanne Sarault from the RCMP Veterans' Association, who served as Masters of Ceremonies. The RCMP Veterans' Association National Office in Ottawa was responsible for communicating with veterans across the country to solicit nominations for the award.

The NHQ Awards are just one of the ceremonies taking place across the country. A total of 468 recipients will receive the *Second Man* Award – an honorary, silver brooch with the RCMP crest, and a certificate of appreciation from the RCMP Commissioner. Ceremonies have also been held in Calgary, Whitehorse, Charlottetown, Halifax and Regina.

The creation of the *Second Man* Award was approved by the RCMP in October 2010. The contributions are chronicled in the 2004 book, "When the *Second Man* was a Woman," by Ruth Lee-Knight, the inspiration behind the *Second Man* Award.

La GRC salue ses héroïnes méconnues

Mardi, le 10 septembre 2013, le surintendant principal Ron Mostrey, commandant de la Direction générale (DG) de la GRC, et le Commissaire adjoint à la retraite Graham Muir, président de la Division d'Ottawa de l'Association des anciens de la GRC, ont rendu hommage aux conjointes de membres de la GRC qui ont appuyé la carrière policière de leur mari dans certaines des communautés les plus isolées du pays.

Quinze femmes ont ainsi vu honorer les contributions qu'elles ont apportées à la GRC depuis le début des années 1900, souvent sans aucune reconnaissance. Leurs histoires mettent en valeur les difficultés propres aux différents postes où elles ont vécu, souvent dans des logements inadéquats, avec à leur charge une famille grandissante.

Pendant cette période de l'histoire de la Gendarmerie, les femmes apuyaient souvent les opérations policières de différentes façons, notamment en répondant au téléphone, en fouillant les prisonnières et en préparant des repas pour les détenus. Elles accueillaient régulièrement chez elles des officiers haut gradés de la GRC, des juges, des médecins et des infirmières de passage, leur offrant gîte,

couvert et divertissement.

« Ces femmes exceptionnelles incarnent l'engagement et les sacrifices quotidiens que consentent encore aujourd'hui les proches de ceux qui portent l'uniforme », fait valoir le surintendant principal Mostrey. « Elles allaient même au-delà du strict soutien familial, participant dans bien des cas aux activités courantes de petits détachements éloignés et forgeant ainsi des liens cruciaux avec les communautés que nous nous employons à servir et à protéger. »

Jack Briscoe et Suzanne Sarault, de l'Association des Anciens de la GRC, ont fait office de maîtres de cérémonie lors de la remise des prix à la DG. Le bureau national de l'Association des anciens de la GRC à Ottawa s'est chargé de communiquer avec les anciens du pays entier à la recherche de candidatures.

D'autres cérémonies de remise s'ajouteront à celle de la DG. Au total, 468 femmes se verront décerner le prix « Deuxième Homme », qui se compose d'une



Members who wish to have their badge encased in acrylic must complete form 2455 and have it signed by their line officer. Members are urged not to forward their current Laminated ID Card to National Compensation Services. 




