Le compte à rebours est lancé.

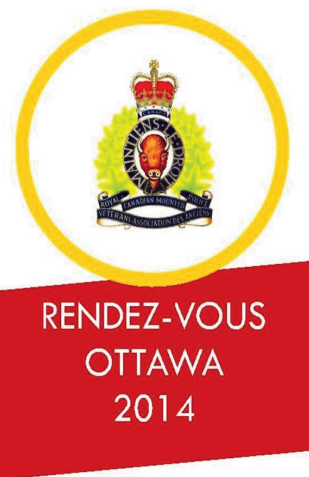

In 2008, the Ottawa Chapter of the Bruce Denniston Bone Marrow Society began a program with the Ottawa Hospital to courier bone marrow and blood products required for their transplantation operations. This program involved the training of volunteers to the medical standards required in the handling of these products.

The Ottawa Hospital held a reception on February 6th, 2013 to acknowledge the 100th mission and to thank the Society for their partnership in this vital service. As a result of this partnership, medical staff have been relieved of this travel responsibility and their time is used to focus on the medical aspects of transplantation.

At present there are over 40 couriers involved in the program, with 20 being retired or working with the RCMP and the balance coming from a variety of work experiences including the public service, business and other private sector professions.

This reception provided the venue to pay tribute to the volunteers for their service which was acknowledged in the remarks of Dr. Jack Kitts, President of the Ottawa Hospital and Dr. Graham Sher, CEO of Canadian Blood Service. Ottawa Chapter President Jeff Turner thanked everyone for their attendance and their recognition of the importance of the Courier Program.

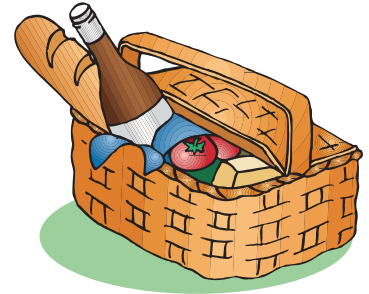

- **The Canada Not-For-Profit Corporations Act:** The Board of Directors delegated the responsibility for the transition to the new Canada Not-For-Profit Corporations Act to a Committee of Members, chaired by Director Murray Milne, Saskatoon Division. Dave Leblanc, Director and Vice President Manitoba Division; Ian Atkins, President, Nova Scotia Division; Bob Kells, President, Calgary Division; Governor Larry Power, Newfoundland Division; and Executive Director, Jack Briscoe are members of the Committee. National President Cal Small and National Secretary Alex Geddes sit as observers. The Committee has produced a guide for the information of all members of the Association that highlights the key changes that are legislated pursuant to the Act. **A workshop will held on Friday, May 31st, 2013 at the AGM in Saskatoon** in order to provide members with an overview of the legislated changes that impact on the future of the Association. **Delegates are encouraged to attend this important information session.**
- **Assistance to homeless RCMP and Canadian Forces (CF) Veterans:** National is working on the Association to adopt a program to identify and assist all Homeless RCMP and CF Veterans within their respective communities and arrange to have then RCMP members involved in a joint partnership wherein members working on patrol or other duties throughout Canada would also identify and assist homeless veterans.

On March 15, the Division held a Concert and Movie at the Capital Theatre. Commissioner L.H. NICHOLSON opened the event. The Band played a selection of pieces and then they showed three movies. They were File 1365, also known as The Connor's Case; Making Mounties and Canadian Crime Busters. The initial request to hold the event, which was made to the Lord's Day Alliance of Canada at Toronto, was not approved until the Division clarified whether it was going to charge an admission fee. The Lord's Day Act of Canada forbid any charges, direct or indirect. Admission had to be free, but the Division could take up a collection of voluntary donations. After the Division clarified that it would not sell tickets, the Alliance gave its approval. A total of \$502.52 was collected of which \$202.50 went toward expenses and \$300.02 went for charitable purposes. The Division held a similar event the following year.

In the service of Canada

At the RCMP Vets Meeting on April 9, when we paused to remember members listed in the last Post I was very pleased that those who served in the trenches in the Battle of Vimy Ridge during the First World War were also included.

My father-in-law, John O'Neill, Reg # 55675 Canadian Expeditionary Force was there. He served from 1914 to 1919 was wounded and hospitalized in France. He recovered and returned to Canada in 1919.

He then joined the Dominion Police serving through all the changes of the force the N.W.M.P -- the R.N.W.M.P -- the RCMP. He retired to pension Reg # 8072 Cpl. John O'Neill in 1945. He continued to serve his country with the Corps of Commissioners and died on duty on Parliament Hill Jan 30 1962 at the age of 73.

During World War II, many RCMP members served with the Canadian Army overseas in the Canadian Provost Corps. Others, from the RCMP Marine Division, served with the Royal Canadian Navy, while a number from the RCMP Air Division served with the Royal Canadian Air Force. In the normal course of events, these members were awarded the CVSM. Other RCMP members served at home in security and wartime duties but, after the war, were not eligible for the CVSM. In 2006, an Order-in-Council concerning the granting of this honour was approved to allow former RCMP members who served on the home front, to be awarded the CVSM. Remembering special friends

Over the last 24 years of my service, spent with the Concert Band, I was privileged to perform on the same stage as many of Canada's leading entertainers. This past month we lost two of our treasured vocalists, George Beverly Shea and the incomparable Rita McNeil.



On numerous occasions at World's Fairs in Vancouver (1986) and Brisbane, Australia (1988) we had the good fortune to socialize with Rita and hearing all about her intense love for her home at Big Pond on Cape Breton Island. She loved performing her unique style of music and it was obvious everytime she went out to centre stage that her solos wouldn't take long and she could then phone the family back at her tea room at Big Pond. If you ever visit there you will see a picture of her favorite band, the RCMP, hanging on the wall.

The other friend of the Force was "Bev" Shea who hailed from Winchester, Ont., 30 miles south of Ottawa. I was privileged to have been invited to the unveiling of the sign at the side of the high-

way at Winchester noting that it was the birthplace of this great world class gospel singer.

The following day, before a crowd of 4000 in the local arena, I was asked to sing the solo that "Bev" had sung at his very first mission at Westport, Ont. when he was only 17 yrs. old. In conversation the previous day, he told me that he had gone to the RCMP recruiting station at the old Justice building when he was 18 yrs. When the recruiting officer told him he might be obliged to work in the Yukon, he decided against it even though he had great admiration for the Force.

After singing my solo I came over to Bev and to the delight of everyone present, including those representatives of the Billy Graham Crusade, I placed my stetson on his head. He was blown away and in correspondence since he always commented about how visitors to his home always asked about the Mountie stetson.



I had the opportunity to sing with "Bev" and we became good friends. His life left this world a great legacy of a fine talent. He was a humble man who performed live before 220 million people over his 104 years. He is now buried at the Billy Graham

Library compound in North Carolina.

She was a real class act that made all Canadians extremely proud. We still here from Tom King, her husband who was a talented musician in his own right performing with his show band "The Royal Chicagoans".

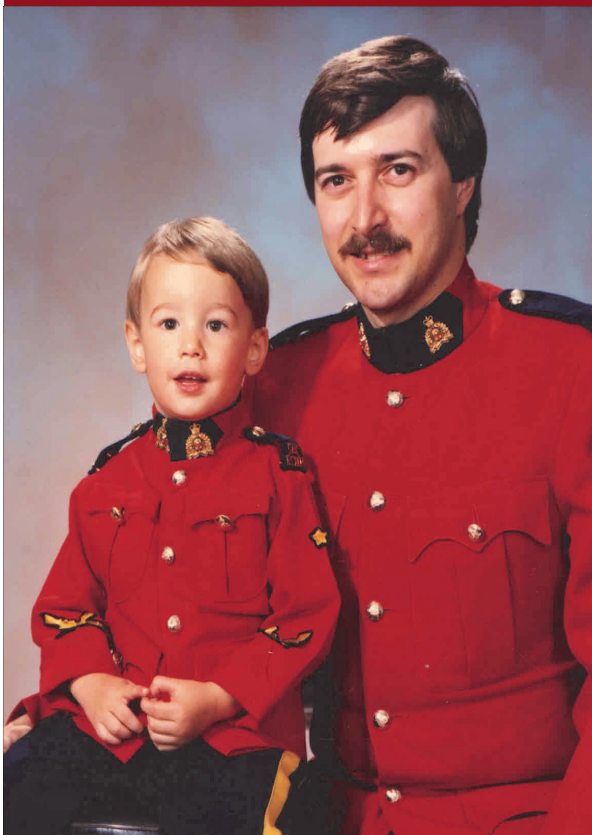
