Life Membership

Director Bob McKee, Chair of the Membership Committee, presented a resolution on Life Membership. The motion to accept the resolution was seconded by Vice President Dave Leblanc, Manitoba Division.

Essentially this resolution was focused on assessing per capita dues for Life Members, effective January 2014.

Director McKee provided the rationale for the resolution to the members and this was followed by several comments from the floor. After an engaging discussion, including the parliamentary procedure pursuant to Robert's Rules of Order, President Dennis Roughley, Georgian Bay Division moved that the resolution be tabled to the AGM 2014 in Ottawa. Motion was carried.

Per Capita Assessment

Director Al Rivard, Chair of the National Operations Committee, presented a resolution to increase the national per capita assessment by \$10.00.

Director Rivard presented a brief overview of the intent of the resolution to the meeting of members which followed an earlier and more formal presentation to the delegates at the National Council Meeting on Friday morning.

The resolution was carried by more than a 2/3 majority vote.

Associate Membership

In 2009, President Hank Moorlag, Yukon Division, presented a resolution for Divisions to extend voting privileges to Associate Members.

Due to a procedural error, the resolution did not proceed at the Whitehorse AGM in 2009 and it was therefore re-introduced in Saskatoon.

The resolution was carried and Associate Members have been given the right to vote on Divisional issues.

Comme vous le savez, la division d'Ottawa sera l'hôte de l'AGA/Congrès de l'Association des Anciens en 2014. Cet événement est une opération de grande envergure et un groupe de bénévoles est déjà à la tâche depuis trois ans aux fins de planification. Nous espérons accueillir entre 500 et 700 Anciens et conjoint(es) ici à Ottawa.

Il reste beaucoup de travail à accomplir, et votre participation fera une différence. Les membres de la division peuvent contribuer au succès de cet événement de plusieurs façons – vous inscrire tôt, faire du bénévolat et/ou faire une contribution financière.

La dernière fois que cet événement a eu lieu à Ottawa était en 1999 et à ce moment-là, les membres ont apporté un soutien financier de 23,000 \$ par leurs contributions volontaires afin d'y assurer la viabilité financière.

Over the past several months, the Committee, chaired by Director Murray Milne, Saskatoon Division, has been heavily engaged in drafting the Articles of Continuance and the new Association by-laws. This has been an intensive process of deliberation to ensure that the Association is fully compliant with the legislation and that both the Articles and our revised by-laws are reflective of the spirit and intent of the law and in the best interests of all members of the Association. Delegates were provided with a detailed briefing from President Ian Atkins, Nova Scotia Division and President Bob Kells, Calgary Division where the key changes arising from the legislation were fully explained. The deadline for submission of the RCMP Veterans' Association Articles of Continuance to Corporations Canada is October 17, 2014 and all Division Presidents have been asked to identify a representative to work with the Committee as we move toward a resolution to adopt the Articles and the revised by-laws on June 5th at AGM 2014 in Ottawa. The consultation process is critically important to ensure that the Association is well positioned for the future and the Committee is confident that together we will successfully rise to the challenge. In the mid 1980s I was setting up a Tour for the RCMP Band in Australia. On the way home, I stopped in Fiji for some R & R where I met a newly retired couple. The gentleman informed me that he had just retired from the railway in Western Canada and that he and his wife were doing some post retirement traveling and had been in Australia for about a month.

In speaking with them, I learned that they were originally from Poland and that they had fled their home country in 1942 during the second world when Hitler was invading. Although his family, including a brother, did manage to successfully escape, they became separated and dispersed to other parts of Europe and this gentleman eventually emigrated to Canada. He married and started a family and lived and worked in western Canada for most of his adult life. As the conversation continued, he told me that he had gone back to Poland to visit his old neighbourhood and spoke with some of the residents who had returned to their old houses after the war. He asked many of these people if they had seen any members of his family since the war, including his brother, or if they knew of their whereabouts. Their answer was a unanimous no so he left his name with several of the neighbours on the off-chance that should his brother return they could pass on this information and a reunion could be arranged. But no one ever contacted them.

During their travels across Australia they decided, on the spur of the moment, to take a quick side trip to Adelaide to see some more of the countryside and visit this town which was not on their original itinerary. As they had been away for a couple of weeks at this point, they decided to send a couple of postcards to some friends back home in Canada as well as to their children. They stopped into the local post office in Adelaide with their addressed mail and asked the post mistress how much it would be for stamps. The

post mistress picked up the post cards and looked at the addresses and told them how much it would cost. In looking at the destination she couldn't help but notice one of the post cards which was addressed to one of their children and she commented that their name was very unusual. Oh yes, said this gentleman very proudly, "We are Polish." You know the post mistress said there is a family that lives about 10 kilometres out of town with this same name. Again on a total whim they decided to go for a short drive and speak with these people whom they did not know, just to say hello to a fellow countryman.

When they arrived at the house, they went to the door and knocked. When the door opened I could not begin to imagine the shock and emotion that this wonderful couple could have experienced when they realized that the person who answered the door was his missing brother of over forty years. They were invited in and spent some time together getting caught up on forty years of separation and what had happened in those years apart. As I wiped away the tears he told me that they had exchanged addresses and were arranging a family reunion back in Canada so that their families could get to know one and other and become a family again.

I was a 22 year veteran of the RCMP Band at the time and I consider myself extremely lucky to have experienced some incredible moments such as this during my career. It has taught me that life is precious and that we should savour every moment with family and friends.




Some 'first times' in the history of the Ottawa Division Veterans' Association

- First President: Edward Carroll
- First RGM was held on July 16, 1947 and attended by 37 ex-RCMP members
- First amount for membership 'dues' was \$2.00 per month in 1947
- First 'Honorary Member' was Sgt. George Stanley Howard, Editor of the RCMP Quarterly on November 28, 1947
- First 'smoker' held in the GG Foot Guards Mess at the Drill Hall in 1947
- First 'annual dinner' at the Ottawa Hotel in 1949 with Commissioner Wood and wife attending
- Division's first mixed social was a supper and dance on April 27, 1950, at the Royal Canadian Army Service Corps Barracks.
- In 1965, the Commissioner authorized the Division to use Long Island Summer Camp for Socials
- In 1966, the Division hosted its first AGM on behalf of the Association
- In 1967, the Division's name was changed from 'C' Division to Ottawa Division
- Story-telling period at RGMs was introduced on March 10, 1972
- Draws at the end of RGMs began on June 13, 1972
- Civilian Members were authorized to join the Association on retirement in 1976
- The WIVES (Wonderful Intelligent Vital Enthusiastic Spouses) was formed in 1983
- In 1992 the Division held its first annual golf tournament at Pineview Golf Course
- The name "Vets' News" was changed to "The Spirit"






