Canada Not-For-Profit Corporations Act New Association By-Laws

On October 17, 2014, the above-mentioned Act will be law. As a result, the by-laws that governed our Association until now will be no longer in effect. The Board of Directors from our National Office have tirelessly drawn up new by-laws that will move our organization into the future. Sometimes change is good. In this case it will be for the benefit of the Association. The new by-laws will allow all paid-up members to vote on many issues brought to the Annual General Meeting held every Summer. Audits will also be conducted annually by certified accountants. Random audits of the Association's Divisions will occur.

The new by-laws will be on the agenda at the upcoming 2014 AGM "Rendez-Vous" Ottawa which will be held June 5 to 8, 2014. We will be asked at the RGM on April 8 to vote for the new by-laws so that our President can represent us at the meeting.

Jack Briscoe of the National Executive briefed our Division Executive Committee on January 8th and I provided a brief verbal update at our RGM on January 14th. You can find Jack Briscoe's presentation on our website at <http://www.rcmp-grcvetsottawa.ca> under administration. It is imperative that the new by-laws and articles of continuance be supported and adopted by resolution at our upcoming 2014 AGM, "Rendez-Vous Ottawa". Each of us needs to be informed and engaged. 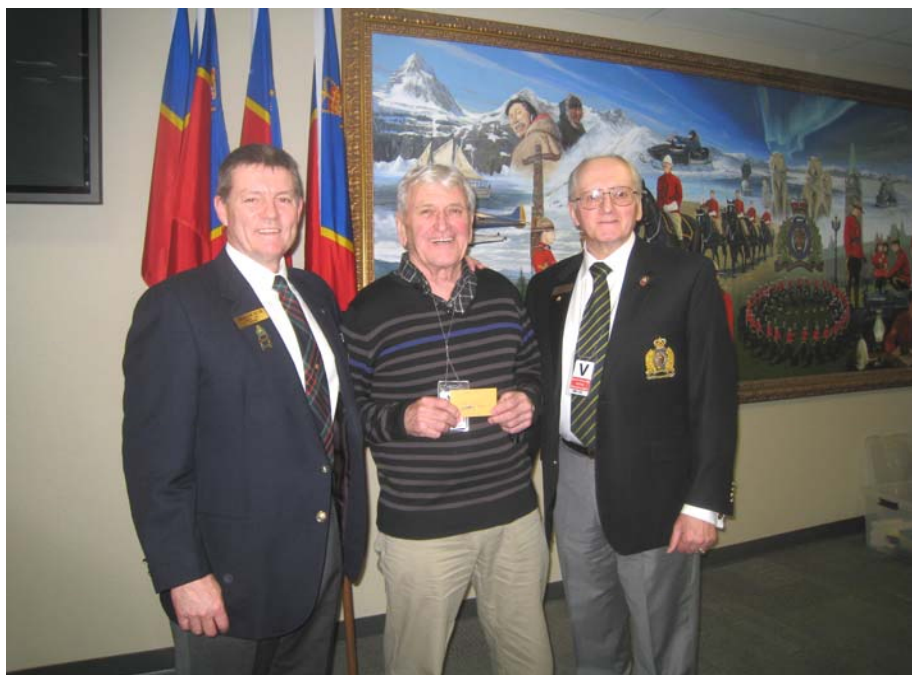

Veteran Encourages Commissioner's Commendation for Bravery

Lutsel K'e, NT, is a small community of approximately 295 people* located on the east arm of Great Slave Lake. On January 14th, 2014 something very special took place with the bringing together of the entire Dene Community with the Top Brass of "G" Division to present the highest RCMP recognition of a Commissioner's Commendation.

53 years ago, then Constable Garth Hampson was awakened one morning by the shouts of children yelling "Fire" outside his patrol cabin at Snowdrift, now Lutsel K'e. A nearby native tent was engulfed in flames. He later learned that a nine year old girl, Celine Nataway had saved four small children she was babysitting. She actually had to pull the youngest child from under the bed to escape the burning tent. Garth noted the act of bravery, recommending that she be honoured, but no formal recognition was made at the time.

Decades went by and, although the incident was often recalled, it wasn't until Garth returned to Old Fort Reliance with his son Brad in August 2011 that he happened to meet up with Celine once more.

This coincidence could not go by without her act of bravery finally being recognized. Garth prepared a formal submission to RCMP HQ in Ottawa.

"The ceremony was conducted as if it were in the formal setting of Government House here in Ottawa" said Garth who sang both the National and Royal anthems. Chief Superintendent Wade Blake, Commanding Officer of "G" Division, presented Celine with her Commendation witnessed by the community of Dene, Elders, Celine's family and the entire student body of which Celine is one of the teachers. A reception followed the speeches and an exciting photo session recorded "this historic event that will be talked about for generations", said Garth.

Musical composition honours Henry Larsen

"It was a very brisk night as we all entered Henry Larsen School in east Ottawa on November 28th. Rather appropriate for what was to take place in the school gymnasium. We were there to witness the premier performance of Marc Bailey's composition "Henry Larsen - An Explorer's Tale". We were probably witnessing the first ever musical composition honouring a member of the RCMP.

How it all came about is a story in itself. The composition by Mark Bailey was undertaken in collaboration with the Faculty of Education at the University of Ottawa and the Curriculum Services of the local school board. This was a unique research/creation project of the grades 7 and 8 students at Henry Larsen school. The result being a composition for a Youth Band. The students had a direct input into the creative process of this original contemporary Canadian composition. The work was conducted by the school's music director, Alexandra Guérin and played by the school band comprised of present and former students at the school.

Present for this historic event was Doreen Riedel, Henry Larsen's daughter and her husband together with the composer and yours truly, having worked under Henry Larsen's command in "G" Div. during the 1950's.

The first part of the program featured music performed by the Ottawa Wind Ensemble, musicians of current and former Canadian Forces band and the now defunct RCMP concert Band, music teachers and other local professional musicians. The final item on the program was the commissioned Henry Larsen piece which was enthusiastically received by the large audience in attendance. The work begins with the orchestral sounds of whales in a background of music capturing ice crystals and the broad expanses of snow and wind with notes played on the chimes. A fine

oboe solo reflected the little vessel, the St. Roch, as it makes its way through the vast expanses of ice in Canada's north. The melody line re-enters and we once more hear the sound of the whales.

2014 marks the 70th anniversary of the St. Roch's voyage, skippered by Henry Larsen, to become the first ever vessel to circumnavigate North America, a feat achieved by one of our own, a Norwegian who came to Canada and became a legend with the RCMP, Henry Larsen."

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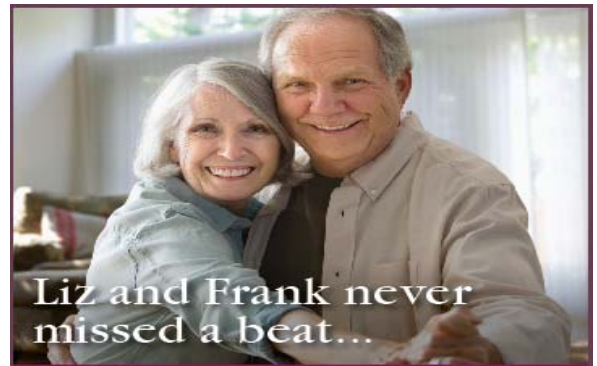

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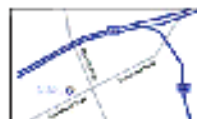
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
