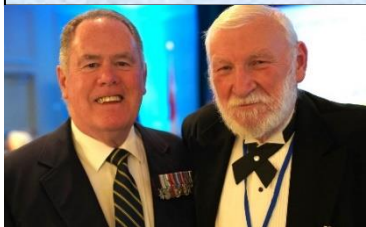

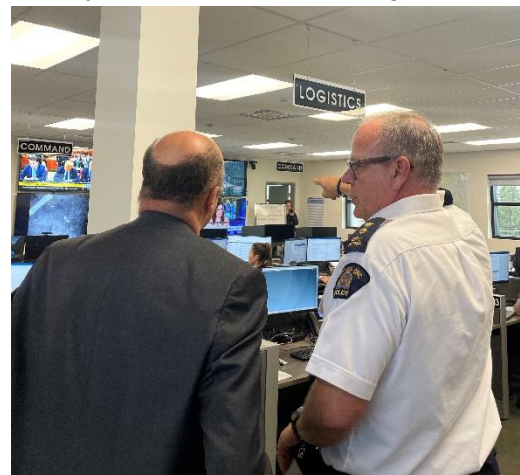
Expansion of the Operational Readiness and Response Unit



On May 15, the Alberta RCMP announced the expansion of the Operational Readiness and Response (ORR) unit. The Alberta RCMP has worked hard to provide Albertans with a state-of-the-art Emergency Operations Centre and ORR unit. This new space for the Divisional Emergency Operation Centre (DEOC) is a significant resource for the province. The DEOC is only one of two in the entire RCMP, and our Alberta RCMP have invested many hours in creating this infrastructure. Whenever there is a sustained or planned operation, the DEOC is stood up. When activated, there are members working around the clock, 24/7 to ensure the safety of Albertans. The role of the DEOC is to provide a centralized location to mobilize and

coordinate a province-wide response to large scale public safety operations. Depending on the size and scope of the emergency, the DEOC can be scaled up to ensure we are directing resources as needed. When active, DEOC ensures our operational commanders and the officers we deploy have everything they need to serve Albertans. They provide logistical support and planning, they serve as liaisons for outside organizations, and they ensure that our members have the proper specialized equipment for the emergencies they're responding to.

The new DEOC space will allow the Alberta RCMP to consolidate all different actors into one location, such as the Alberta Sheriffs Branch, Search and Rescue, and community peace officers, where they can work together and mutually coordinate our resources more

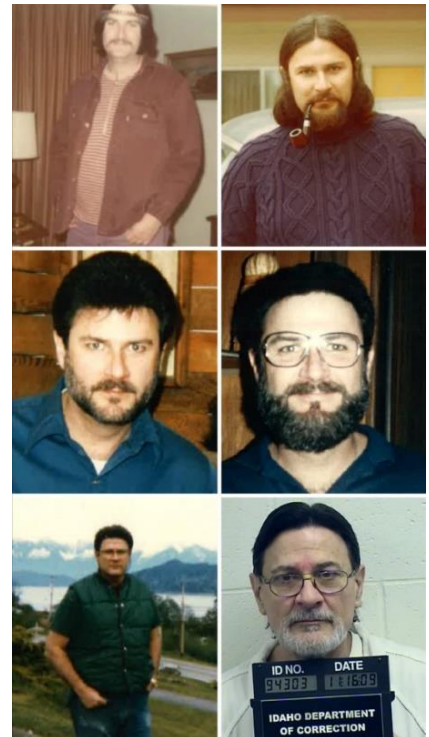


effectively. This integrated approach will go a long way in responding to emergency situations and adapting to changes on the fly.

Alberta RCMP link four historical homicides to deceased serial killer

On May 17, the Alberta RCMP announced it had linked four historical homicides from the 1970s. The now deceased, convicted serial violent sexual offender, Gary Allen Srery, was sentenced to life in prison in 2009. Srery served time in prisons over four decades, dating back to the 1960s. He served time in jails in the United States and in Canada, with convictions for rape, kidnapping, and assault. The Historical Homicide Unit was able to discover, with the advancement of DNA testing, that Srery was responsible for the murders of Eva Dvorak, Patricia McQueen, Melissa Rohorek, and Barbara MacLean.

Over the past 40 years, the Alberta RCMP exhausted investigational means in an attempt to identify the person(s) responsible for these tragic deaths. These files were never closed and were continually being reassessed under the microscope of new information, advancement in technology, and evolution of police techniques. In 2003, police were able to confirm the same suspect was linked to both Melissa Rehorek and Barbara MacLean's murders through DNA. At that time, the suspect's DNA was compared against the National DNA Databank without a match. The profile was uploaded into the Databank and went without a hit for over 20 years.

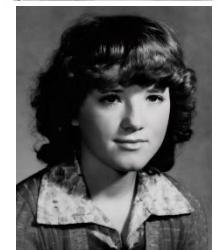


When the tool known as Investigative Genetic Genealogy (IGG) became available, the Alberta RCMP were hopeful they could identify the unknown DNA contributor linked to the Melissa Rehorek and Barbara MacLean homicides.

Genealogists from Convergence IGG were able to start building a family tree based on the SNP profile while CPS consulted with them and completed target testing to help drive the genealogy portion forward. When target testing was complete, Convergence IGG was able to provide a suspect hypothesis.

The resulting investigation, which took RCMP investigators throughout Alberta, British Columbia and several US states confirmed this hypothesis. During this same time, crime scene evidence was resubmitted to the lab from the Dvorak and McQueen investigation. The same unknown male DNA profile was identified on both victims that matched the unknown male DNA profile from the Rehorek and MacLean murders. In light of this new information, the RCMP found that Gary Allen Srery was responsible for the deaths of all four victims.

“For over forty years, investigators did not give up in their pursuit to identify those responsible for these murders,” said Superintendent David Hall, Officer in Charge of the Alberta RCMP’s Serious Crimes Branch. “Identifying the perpetrator does not bring Eva, Patsy, Melissa or Barbara back. It is our hope however, that the families are finally able to have some answers as to what happened to their loved ones all of those years ago.”



National Indigenous History Month

June is National Indigenous History Month. This month, the Alberta RCMP celebrates the contributions of First Nations, Métis, and Inuit people, commemorating their rich history, resilience, and diversity. It is a time to honour the stories and experiences of Indigenous Peoples who have made an incredible impact on this country and this organization.

We recognize that our shared history with Indigenous peoples continues to have lasting impacts across communities we serve. While we acknowledge the past, we also acknowledge our progress as an organization and the steps we are actively taking towards reconciliation.

Today, we are working to increase diversity and Indigenous representation within our organization through recruitment, so that employees reflect the communities we serve. We are also committed to a Reconcile-ACTION strategy in collaboration with Indigenous partners and Elders, increasing community engagement, cultural awareness, and education, while strengthening relationships and reinforcing safety and security with Indigenous peoples.

One way the Alberta RCMP is working towards reconciliation with Indigenous Peoples in Alberta is by hosting annual meetings with the Commanding Officer's Indigenous Advisory Committee. The committee includes Deputy Commissioner Rob Hill, Indigenous Police Officers, and representatives from First Nations and Métis communities across Alberta. Each year, this committee meets to discuss important issues regarding Indigenous Peoples and their communities, and how we can build stronger relationships with Indigenous Peoples. This year's meeting took place last week in Blackfoot Crossing, the historic site of the signing of Treaty No.7.



Pride Month

This June, we celebrate Pride month. Our organization firmly believes that everyone should feel safe, and be treated with equality and respect. We are committed to ensuring everyone we serve can live in communities free from discrimination and bias.

This month, in honour of the 2SLGBTQIA+ community, we will proudly raise the Rainbow Flag outside of Alberta RCMP Headquarters and detachments around the province. In addition to raising the flag, we show our support for the 2SLGBTQIA+ community by standing in solidarity with them as their RCMP, upholding the safety and security of all Albertans.
