
RCMP Veterans Association Saskatoon Division September / October 2024 Newsletter

On July 26th, 2024, Hal Haepting (18457) passed away after being hospitalized in Saskatoon. Hal was 89 years of age. As outlined in our July / August newsletter, Hal was a Charter member of the Saskatoon Division which was founded in 1958. Hal joined the Force on November 30th 1953 and left on October 8th, 1956. After obtaining his law degree, Hal set up a law practice in Unity Saskatchewan. At the time of his passing, Hal was a Life Member of the Saskatoon Division.

On August 9th, 2024 Dan Brunen (24260) died at his home in Warman, Saskatchewan. Dan had a short service with the Force in EDiv before returning to Saskatchewan. He was a proud member of the Saskatoon Division of the Veterans Association. Dan was 81 years of age at his passing.

On October 9th, 1970, Cst. Douglas Bernard Anson, Reg. #21129, and Sgt. Robert James Schrader, Reg.# 15445, died near MacDowell, Sk. Both members were shot and killed on duty, while investigating a domestic dispute.
