



theme in mind, we had someone playing the accordion as people were gathering for the evening. Unfortunately he was unable to stay for dinner, but the music was special.



Miscalculation of Disability Pensions Class Action Settlement

Are you a current or former member of the Canadian Armed Forces or **Royal**Canadian Mounted Police, or their spouse, common-law partner, survivor,
dependent or executor of their estate, who received disability benefits from

Veterans Affairs Canada (VAC) between 2003 and 2023? If so, you may be a Class Member and qualifiable for compensation from a class action settlement related to alleged miscalculations of disability pensions and benefits.

Class Members with an existing payment relationship with VAC will automatically receive the compensation for which they are qualifiable through the usual payment process. These Class Members do not have to submit a claim form to receive payment.

Class Members who do not have an existing payment relationship with VAC must submit a Claim Form or they will not receive compensation.

The deadline to submit a claim form is 19 March 2025.

On October 24, nine officers from the Alberta RCMP were proud recipients of Decorations for Bravery from Her Excellency, the Right Honourable Mary Simon. This

International Association of Chiefs of Police Awards

Congratulations to S/Sgt. Ray Savage, who was awarded the 2024 International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) award for Excellence in Law Enforcement for his development of the National Reintegration Program (NRP). This officer-led, peer-driven program was developed by S/Sgt. Savage in 2015, and became a national RCMP program in 2021.

The NRP is an interactive program dedicated to ensuring officers are provided the support they need to confidently return to operational duties after a serious injury, incident, or extended leave. Since its inception, the NRP has emerged as a standard of support for all RCMP officers.

Commanding Officer's Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion Leadership Award

This month marked the inaugural Alberta RCMP Commanding Officer's Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion (EDI) Leadership Award presentation. The award is presented to an individual or team that shows a personal passion for achieving EDI in their workplace or community, outside of their regular mandate.
