



THE PIT BULL

I believe my fellow members would attest to the fact that when I dealt with individuals I was usually fairly patient and calm. There were occasions, however, when pressed into unique situations, I responded with swift and determined action, thereby being anointed with the nicknames “Chucky Beaver” or “The Pit Bull”. The following stories give a good example of the Pit Bull in action. The Whitehorse RCMP Telecom operator received a 911 call from a distraught woman stating that there were two men fighting in her home and that she was fearful for her children and herself. I was the first responder and arrived at the residence in short order, with other members en route. I tried the doorknob; it turned, but pulling on the door it wouldn’t open. The anguished cries of young ones continued to resonate in my ears.

I jumped down the rear stairs and raced back to the front door. I could hear the fracas adjacent to it. Trying the doorknob again, and noting it was still locked, I took two steps back and with all my might propelled myself into the door. To my surprise, and to the astonishment of the men fighting behind the door, the mother and children viewing the scene from the corner of the living room, and to the members just arriving, the door, along with the entire rectangular doorframe, crashed into the house, flattening the two combatants. For a mini second, our world stalled, as everyone gawked in disbelief at what had just happened.

I scrambled onto the door, which became a teetering seesaw, with the two men serving as the reluctant fulcrum. My stunned partners, now ascending the front steps, viewing the absurd sight, began to titter.

Stepping off, I knelt down and observed two men wedged between the door and the floor. As I began to raise the door and frame to alleviate their discomfort, the two, gaining their senses, started spewing obscenities, to which I simply let the door and frame descend in a manner that effectively shut them up.

“Looks like everything is under control here,” one officer stated. “The Pit Bull has arrived.” The bewildered lady of the house, realizing there was no longer a doorframe, let alone a door, told the other officers she had hollered for me to use the back door, as it was open. She wondered why I hadn’t come in that way. I quickly responded that I had tried the door but it wouldn’t open.

One of the members went outside to the back door to verify. He simply turned the knob and pushing the door, entered. Apparently, in my exuberance, I must have pulled instead of pushed. That darn adrenalin!

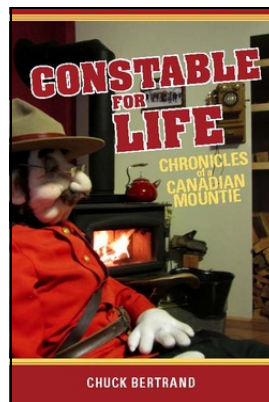

Important Notice

With the RCMP Veterans' Association making changes to comply with the federal Not-For-Profit Act, each Association member will now have the ability to cast their individual vote on each Annual General Meeting (AGM) motion regardless of whether they are in attendance at the AGM or not. This new voting process will come into effect in 2015.

To comply with this new voting procedure, our Association has decided to proceed with e-voting and whereby each Association member is emailed an electronic ballot by an independent company. Veterans, who do not have an email address, will receive the ballot via the regular mail with a pre-paid return envelope.

To test this new voting process, four Association Divisions volunteered to be test locations: London Division; Yukon Division; Ottawa Division and Vancouver Division.

For the Vancouver Division members, you will receive an e-voting or regular mail message during the latter part of November 2014 (15th - 30th). Messages will only be sent to Veterans in 'good standing.'

For those Veterans who do not have an email address, you will receive a mailed ballot similar to what is illustrated on page 3. Veterans with an email address will receive one that is being sent out via our RCMP Veterans Communiqué.

It is a simple matter of checking your response to the two questions and returning the message to the sender. Veterans receiving the ballot in the mail will check their response and mail back the completed ballot.

Don't provide a response now - wait until you receive it from Simply Voting.

We encourage all Veterans to participate in this testing. Simply Voting will provide us the result of your responses and will be posted in our next Scarlet & Gold Newsletter.

From the Pen of the Acting President, Keith Leishman

Somehow Remembrance Day becomes a lot more poignant when one takes into account the events of October 22, 2014 in Ottawa, with the tragic murder of Canadian Armed Forces **Cpl. Nathan Cirillo**, and the role played by Parliamentary Sgt.-at-Arms, Kevin Vickers, a former RCMP member, in bringing this tragedy to a quick conclusion. Only days previously, Canadian Armed Forces **W.O Patrice Vincent** was murdered in St. Jean-sur-Richelieu, Quebec, in an event that was equally without reason. As tragic and senseless also was the murder of three RCMP Constables, **David Ross, Fabrice Georges Geraudan, and Douglas James Larche**, on June 4, 2014 in Moncton, N.B., and the serious wounding of two of their fellow officers. So, when we all attend our local Remembrance Day ceremonies on November 11th let us all remember the sacrifices these fine Canadians made. And let us also remember the families that are left behind to mourn them. As I write this I find it is hard to ignore the media circus surrounding the recent mid-term elections held by our neighbours to the south. And thinking of elections brings to mind our own elections here at home. No, not our upcoming municipal elections. I'm speaking of our own RCMP Veterans' Association Vancouver Division elections that will take place at our general membership meeting on November 20, 2014 at Newlands Golf & Country Club. The following offices and Director positions are vacant and need to be filled by election of members who are in good standing: Offices of President and Vice-President, and Director of Social Activities & Events, Director of Liaison to the RCMP and Government, and Director of Revitalization. If you feel called to serve in any of these positions, or know of a member who may be willing, please notify Director Dick Hawkshaw (raphawk@shaw.ca), who is Chairman of the Nominating Committee. After all is said and done, it is **your** Association, and it can only succeed in meeting the needs of members if a certain number step forward and become involved. I look forward to seeing you all at this meeting. Speaking of elections brings to mind another elections-related matter. I have mentioned at our last few general meetings a major change in the operation of the RCMP Veterans' Association that was a result of the Association falling under the provisions of the *Canada Not-for-profit Corporations Act*. This relates to the manner in which the membership will vote on the election of Association Directors and on resolutions that are brought to the Association's AGM each year. Henceforth, voting at AGMs will be carried out by Electronic Voting (or EVoting). In the past, each division's membership voted on those running for National Director positions and on Association resolutions weeks before an AGM. Based on the results of this vote, each Division representative to the AGM (usually the Division President) carried the total number of votes of members from his/her division to the AGM and exercised them as a bloc proxy. The electronic age, however, now allows for EVERY member to directly vote on crucial matters concerning the Association at an AGM (or at a Special General Meeting as well). EVoting will be used for the first time by the RCMP Veterans' Association at the upcoming AGM 2015 in Quebec City in May 2015. Before that happens, however, the new EVote system must be tested to ensure its success at Quebec City. And that is where Vancouver Division enters the picture. As Sheldon Boles, our Division EVote Coordinator, elaborates elsewhere in this issue, our division is one of three chosen from 30 Association divisions across Canada to carry out a test vote of the new system. Sheldon explains in detail how the test will work for those of you with computers, and for those without computers who will vote by postal ballot. Please remember that this is only a **Test Vote. It is not the questions that are important, nor the actual results. The most important issue is that YOU EXERCISE YOUR VOTE.** In this way we all participate in ensuring that the system functions well when it comes time to vote on issues brought to the AGM 2015 meeting. As a final comment on this matter, divisions will NOT be required to use the EVote system in managing their affairs. And before I wander off for my afternoon cup of coffee, I would like to remind everyone of the **Vancouver Division December 11, 2014 Levee**. This is by far our division's most popular yearly event. And this year promises to be unique. In honour of the 40th Anniversary of the first troop of female members to enter RCMP training, we will *Celebrate Women in the RCMP*. Tickets will be available shortly from any members of the Executive. Deputy Commissioner Craig Callens has accepted an invitation to attend this event (as he did last year) and will be accompanied by A/Commissioner Sharon Woodburn (Human Resources Officer). It is hoped that our members will take this opportunity to extend a special welcome and Christmas greetings to our guests, and to all female members of the RCMP, currently serving or retired, who may attend this event. I look forward to seeing you all there!
